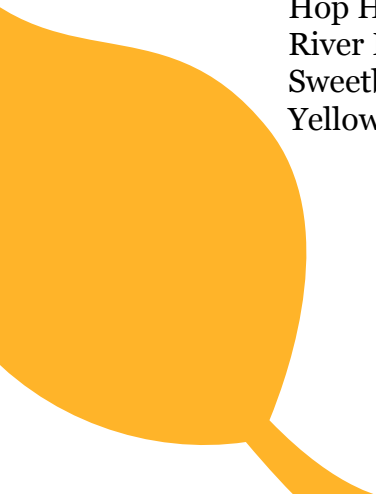


Small Trees (<30 Feet)

<u>Common Name</u>	<u>Scientific Name</u>	<u>Characteristics</u>
Blackhaw Viburnum	Viburnum prunifolium	White flowers, attracts birds and butterflies
Downy Serviceberry	Amelanchier arborea	White showy blooms
Eastern Redbud	Cercis canadensis	Showy pale purple flowers
Flowering Dogwood	Cornus florida	Showy white flowers
Pagoda Dogwood	Cornus alternifolia	Showy flowers, attracts birds and butterflies
Pawpaw	Asimina triloba	Edible fruit, purple blooms, tolerates wet soil
Red Buckeye	Aesculus pavia	Showy red flowers
Washington Hawthorn	Crataegus phaenopyrum	White flowers, red winter berries, has thorns
White Fringe Tree	Chionanthus virginicus	Showy fragrant white flowers
Wild Plum	Prunus americana	Showy white flowers

Medium Trees (30-45 Feet)

<u>Common Name</u>	<u>Scientific Name</u>	<u>Characteristics</u>
American Hornbeam	Carpinus caroliniana	Gold and red autumn foliage, ideal bird habitat
Hop Hornbeam	Ostrya virginiana	Gold autumn foliage, excellent shade tree
River Birch	Betula nigra	Ornamental bark adds winter interest
Sweetbay Magnolia	Magnolia virginiana	Showy fragrant flowering tree
Yellowwood	Cladrastis kentukea	Cascading white flowers, striking yellow leaves

Large Trees (>45 Feet)

<u>Common Name</u>	<u>Scientific Name</u>	<u>Characteristics</u>
Bald Cypress	Taxodium distichum	Vibrant orange autumn foliage, no raking
Black Gum	Nyssa sylvatica	Fabulous red autumn foliage
Bur Oak	Quercus macrocarpa	Stately large trunk and an ideal shade tree
Cherrybark Oak	Quercus pagodifolia	Excellent shade tree and bird habitat
Chinkapin Oak	Quercus muehlenbergii	Excellent shade tree and bird habitat
Hackberry	Celtis occidentalis	Fast growing, feeds birds, hosts butterflies
Kentucky Coffeetree	Gymnocladus dioicus	Green-white blooms, tolerates wet or dry soil
Northern Catalpa	Catalpa speciosa	Heart-shaped leaves and striking white flowers
Northern Red Oak	Quercus rubra	Fast growing, deep red autumn foliage
Post Oak	Quercus stellata	Ideal for poor soil, supports bluejays
Shellbark Hickory	Carya lacinosa	Best in large spaces, gold autumn foliage
Shortleaf Pine	Pinus echinata	Our only evergreen, no leaves to rake!
Shumard Oak	Quercus shumardii	Vibrant red-orange autumn foliage
Swamp Chestnut Oak	Quercus michauxii	Good for low-lying areas, crimson autumn foliage
Swamp White Oak	Quercus bicolor	Long-lived, gold autumn foliage
Sycamore	Platanus occidentalis	Filters air pollution, striking camouflage-like bark
Tuliptree	Liriodendron tulipifera	Fast growing, pyramidal form, yellow-gold flowers
White Oak	Quercus alba	Strong, long-lived, excellent windbreaks
Willow Oak	Quercus phellos	Willowy leaves, yellow-orange autumn foliage
